Early today, we received notice that one of our \*\*\* Team members has become ill and has been tested for the COVID-19 virus. Although there has been a positive diagnosis of the staff member, the employee was not exhibiting any symptoms during their last time on campus. The staff member was not diagnosed until several days later, therefore, based on guidance from the Department of Health and CDC guidelines, the chance of spread is negligible. Contact with the staff was limited, and everyone was practicing appropriate social distancing and wearing masks at all times. However, out of an abundance of caution, we are notifying you of the notice that we received.

We have informed everyone who may have had contact with the individual and provided guidance in alignment with recommendations from the Department of Health.

Please remember that this person's identity as well as their medical condition is protected information. Sharing details about someone's health conditions violates their rights. Please respect this person's privacy by not sharing rumors and speculations.

The Fontana Unified School District continues to work to limit unnecessary risk to our students, families, personnel, and community. We will keep you posted as we receive more information.

Please remember that the best plan for addressing the COVID-19 virus is to remain informed and follow the simple steps to help contain the spread of this virus:

- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue, cloth, or with your inner elbow when sneezing or coughing.
- Always thoroughly wash hands for at least 20 seconds with soap and water.
- When soap and water are not available, use hand sanitizer to wash hands.
- Maintain appropriate social distancing.
- If you are not feeling well, please stay home when you are sick.
- In the case of possible exposure to the virus, restrict your access to others, and seek guidance from a medical professional.
