BACKGROUND:

Existing state law requires all graduating high school students to complete one course in visual or performing arts or foreign language. Beginning with the 2012/2013 school year (Class of 2013), AB 1330 authorizes local educational agencies to accept a Career Technical Education (CTE) course as an optional high school graduation requirement in lieu of one course in visual or performing arts or foreign language.

The Fontana Unified School District Board Policy (BP) 6146.1 reviews and updates the requirements for High School Graduation credits and is in need of revision per new California Bill AB 1330. The revised Board Policy 6146.1 with the new High School Graduation requirements is to be effective the 2012/2013 school year. AB 1330 would add completion of a career technical education course as an alternative to the completion of a course in visual or performing arts or foreign language. This option would end in July, 2017 unless its provisions are extended by legislative action.

New language is shown as underlined text in the attached Board Policy 6146.1 document.

The distinction between the high school graduation requirements of the district and the eligibility requirements for CSU and UC admissions are also attached.

- (a) A pupil shall complete all of the following while in grades 9 to 12, inclusive, in order to receive a diploma of graduation from high school:

- (ii) For purposes of this subparagraph, "a course in career technical education" means a course in a district-operated career technical education program that is aligned to the career technical model curriculum standards and framework adopted by the state board, including courses through a regional occupational center or program operated by a county superintendent of schools or pursuant to a joint powers agreement.
- (iii) This subparagraph does not require a school or school district that currently does not offer career technical education courses to start new career technical education programs for purposes of this section.
- (iv) If a school district or county office of education elects to allow a career technical education course to satisfy the requirement imposed by this subparagraph, the governing board of the school district or county office of education, prior to offering that alternative to pupils, shall notify parents, teachers, pupils, and the public at a regularly scheduled meeting of the governing board of all of the following:
- (I) The intent to offer career technical education courses to fulfill the graduation requirement specified in this subparagraph.
- (II) The impact that offering career technical education courses, pursuant to this subparagraph, will have on the availability of courses that meet the eligibility requirements for admission to the California State University and the University of California, and whether the career technical education courses to be offered pursuant to this subparagraph are approved to satisfy those eligibility requirements. BACKGROUND:

During the 2010/2011 school year under Agreement #07/08-0626, the San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools (SBCSS) housed one class of Community Day School for Fontana Unified District (FUSD) at the Fontana Community Day School operated by the SBCSS located at 16711 Arrow Boulevard in Fontana.

This program served FUSD Special Day Class expelled students. Under a collaborative agreement, FUSD provided the teacher and instructional assistants for the classroom, and the SBCSS provided the facility, security, and administration.

Due to the budget crisis California schools are experiencing and the low numbers of students attending this school, the school site has been closed.

Due to this closure, it is necessary to find an alternative site to house these students. San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools, Bob Murphy Community Day School (CDS) campus would be able to serve our expelled special day class (SDC) students as well as resource specialist (RSP) students.

Currently the fee for service is: SDC: \$18,955.00 and RSP: \$2,878.00. Anticipated number of students to be referred for the 2012/13 school year is 5 SDC students and 5 RSP students.

Total not to exceed amount: \$109,165.00

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has determined that fees should be levied in the amounts set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. The District will establish a separate capital facilities account in which all school facility fees collected pursuant to Education Code section 17620 will be deposited and will continue to be maintained, except for temporary investments, as provided in Government Code Section 66006(a). Fees from this account will be expended solely for the purpose of funding the construction or reconstruction of school facilities. Any interest income earned by monies in that account will also be deposited in that account and expended only for the purposes of the construction or reconstruction of school facilities.

The District shall, within 180 days of the close of each fiscal year, make available to the public the information required by Government Code section 66006(b) concerning the separate capital facilities account. The District will review this information at the next regular public meeting not less than 15 days after the availability of the information. Notice of the meeting will be made in accordance with Government Code Section 66006(b).

- 2. The Board will make findings once each fiscal year with respect to any portion of the fee remaining unexpended or uncommitted in the capital facilities account five or more years after deposit of the fee, pursuant to Government Code section 66001(d). If necessary, the District will make refunds or allocations pursuant to Government Code Section 66001(e) and (f).
- 3. Based upon the findings made and evidence presented at this public hearing for levying school facility fees, as well as the evidence presented in the "Developer Fee Justification and Impact Analysis" ("Report") dated June 2012 prepared by School Planning Services, incorporated herein by reference as Exhibit A, the Board of Education hereby reaffirms its earlier findings made in previous resolutions levying fees and further finds:
- (a) The fees are being levied to fund the construction or reconstruction of school facilities within the District, the need for which arises out of students generated from new residential, commercial and industrial construction; and
- (b) There is a reasonable relationship between the use of the school facility fees and the residential, commercial and industrial construction upon which the fees are to be levied, in that the proceeds of the fees will be used for the funding of the construction and reconstruction of school facilities to accommodate the students generated by each of the foregoing types of development. BACKGROUND:

The District's 2012/13 adopted budget has been reviewed by the San Bernardino County Office of Education. The District's budget, as adopted on June 6, 2012, meets the 2012/13 and 2013/14 minimum state reserves level of 2%, however, the budget does not meet the minimum state reserves in the 2014/15 fiscal year as required by the State. The San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools office will allow the District to operate based on the 2012/13 adopted budget.

The County Office of Education's approval of the District's adopted 2012/13 budget is based on the commitment of the District's Board of Education to implement ongoing expenditure reductions sufficient to maintain the District's fiscal solvency and meet its financial obligations through the multi-year projections. The District must have the Board of Education approve and adopt a Board resolution identifying the Board's
